The 2026-27 budget is the first net budget (exclusive of VAT). A flat 20% was deducted from the regular £15,000 budget for Party in the Park to account for VAT. However, many of the suppliers are not VAT registered. The RFO advised that spending of up to £15,000 inclusive of VAT would be acceptable, as this is the budget this event has held for several years and many bookings had already been agreed prior to the budget being set.

Survey Results:

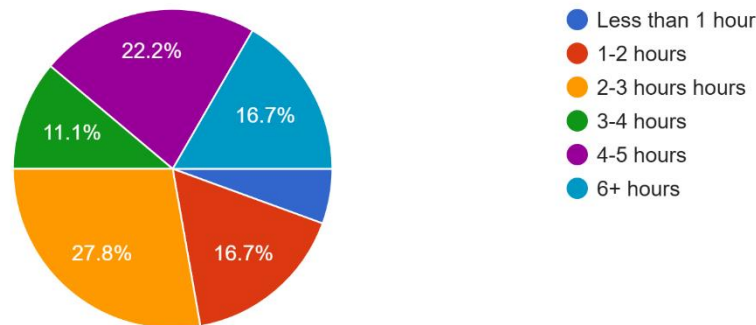
- 18 attendees responded to the survey

The following improvements were suggested:

- Traffic coordination on adjoining roads (2)
- More stalls (3)

- More bar staff (2)

- Chairs/benches/picnic blankets for attendees (3)
- More for children under 2 (soft play)
- Vegan catering
- Climbing walls, gaming vans, fairground rides, craft activities, more entertainment (4)
- More variety of entertainment year to year
- More for children with additional needs
- Shelter for shade (2) or rain (1)
- More reusables such as glasses from bar
- Unlock the playground gate

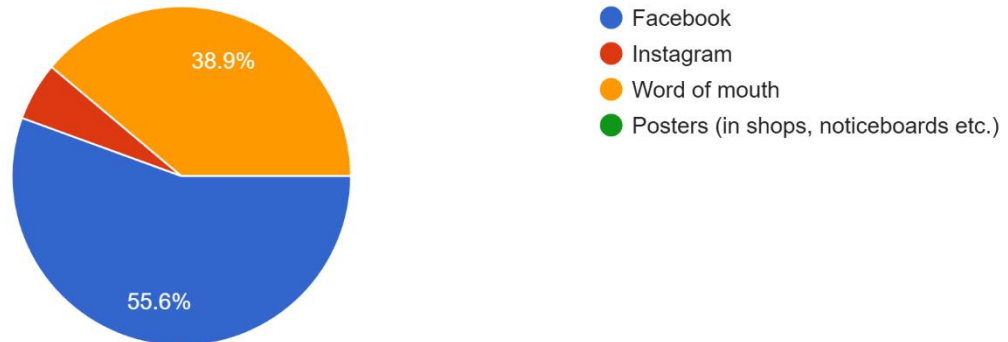
17 respondents answered regarding value for money. 16 of 17 felt the event was good value for money, with comments such as:

1 respondent felt the event was not really value for money as some parts were expensive.

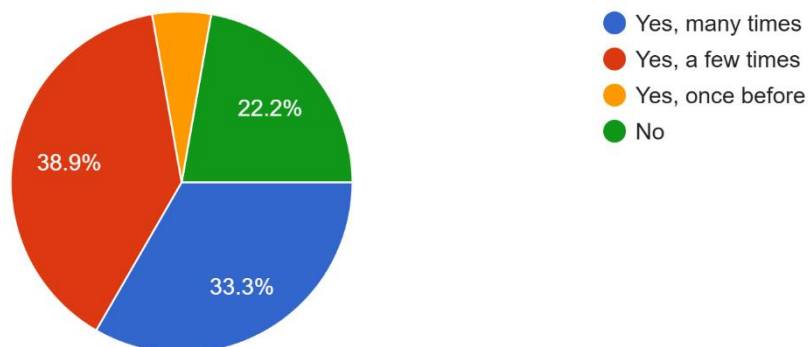
How did you find out about PITP 2026?
